Your club has made a profit of \$16,348 for the year which is not a significant profit however, we have had a year of many changes. We renewed our furniture and carpets and also overhauled the kitchen not to mention the purchase of new course machinery.

Staff changes have been made with a new chef in place and office staff changes following the resignation of Kim Robertson, to whom we wish all the best on her retirement. To honour her 17 years of service to Kiama Golf Club she has been given Honary Membership.

Our General Manager Craig Norman resigned, accepting a position closer to his family home. We wish him well. Our new General Manager Craig Epton has been appointed and is doing a great job.

Since his appointment Craig has put in many hours and added a new dimension with his professional manner and approach to team meetings and accessibility.

I would like to thank all of our board members and their committees who without their commitment and tireless efforts our club could not operate.

The running of the golf side of our business is an enormous, relentless and sometimes thankless task with members being all too ready to offer criticism but no bouquets of support. With that in mind I would like to thank Club Captain Bruce Tapp, Vice President Geoff Peters, ladies President Helen Jones, veterans President Brad Hungerford and their teams. Golf events do not organize themselves and the board are indebted to you all.

We saw a change in Catering with our new head chef Nigel Farry appointed. An exciting new menu came into effect late March with Mystics Wood Fired Cuisine.

The bar staff continue to be of great service together with our cleaning brigade - great work.

To Mark and his green staff what a year - thanks for doing such a great job under circumstances beyond your control. Machinery breakdowns, inclement weather etc. Your foresight in renovating the fairways will come to fruition next Spring and Summer.

Club Professional Greg has continued to support the club in his usual proficient manner, thank you.

I would like to also thank those members of the club who gave their time to support junior, senior and pennants golf.

I give my sincerest condolences to those members who have lost friends and/or family this last year.

To all of the club's members and present board I wish you good health and a great club for the future.

TREASURERS REPORT

Members

Results for the year show a modest **Profit of \$16,348** which given the undermentioned circumstances is considered quite acceptable.

Influences which impacted :

- Movement in most senior management positions
- Internal building renovations and replacement of furnishings
- New restaurant outlet 'Pizza'
- Introduction of new accountancy package
- Continuance of subsidised meals
- Varied forms of entertainment trialed

Balance Sheet and Trading items which would appear to require explanation are noted hereunder.

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Growth in Sales/Gross Profit was offset by increase in Wages of \$74k. Separation payment accounted for majority of this amount.

Modest upward movement in Poker Machine revenue was attributed to our current economic environment.

Machine replacement program is addressed as and when necessary.

Last year's gain in TAB income has been reversed; on.line gambling may be the factor.

Keno returns are unchanged.

Catering	\$ 28,427	- \$60,748
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Favourable increase in sales of \$120k; the cost of subsidised meals has recently been applied to this area in lieu of entertainment. Actual profitability of this unit will then be easier to identify. Majority of upward movement in wages of \$99k reflects increasing staffing needs due to activity plus separation payment to outgoing Manager.

Course	\$171,381	+ \$ 8,375
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Movement has been nominal, many factors impact on results, but are usually weather related. Course Superintendant has, as always, effectively managed expenditure. These figures do not include apportionment of expenses such as i.e. General Insurances, Management etc. due to the accounting complexity.

Advertising Receipts	\$ 20,634	
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On.Course signage promotion has and is being pursued

Audit Fees **\$ 20,347**

An increase of \$12k on previous years.

Increase due to provision of accountancy services by Cronin & Norris in assisting management bed.down the MYOB accounting package.

Entertainment **\$275,941**

This item has increased by \$76k.

Cost of all subsidised meals plus Entertainment have been applied here. As noted above, meal subsidies will henceforth be applied directly to Catering.

Some trialed forms of Entertainment have been reduced or culled in recent months.

Meat Market **- \$ 2,599 (net)**

Above result is acceptable and turnover/support of this activity remains constant.

Bingo **- \$ 15,534 (net)**

Demand from members has seen this activity continue. Subsidies have reduced from \$421pw to \$299pw.

Insurances **\$102,103** **+ \$12,468**

Expanded cover plus the general upward trend in premiums

Competitive quotations are sought at time of renewal

Capital Expenditure

Additional loan funds were provided by our lender to enable the completion of renovations etc. outlined above.

Ability to service the commitments is well within our means.

Summary

With the change in management there naturally comes a change in style, due to experience, personality and work practices. Mr Epton is fulfilling our expectations and we as a Board, enjoy an efficient/progressive relationship.

Change is a constant in this industry due mainly to political and economic factors. These we endeavour to anticipate and deal with appropriately.

Office Manager Kim Robertson retired late last year after many years of unflagging loyalty and dedication to the welfare to the Club. We extend to her our best wishes for a long and happy retirement.

Our senior staff have as always, been very supportive particularly during the period of changed leadership. We express our appreciation and thanks.

The Boards objectives for the coming year are similar to those of the past. ie

- Control of expenditure and enhancing income sources
- Maintaining and improving facilities for the enjoyment of members
- Ongoing training and welfare of our Personnel

In conclusion I thank management, staff and fellow board members for their continued commitment and assistance.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

It is with great pleasure that I write my first annual report for Kiama Golf Club.

Firstly I would like to thank the board for their efforts this year as well as their support they have offered to both me and the staff at the club. There is no disputing the great amount of personal sacrifice that comes with being a board member of the club. Having worked side by side with the board in the latter half of the year I can assure you that the board has the member's best interests in the forefront of their minds.

The 2010 year saw some great changes to the club especially from a physical sense. During the year the club had considerable capital expenditure on such things as a new gaming membership system that holds the club in a far greater position if gaming pre commitment is legislated, a wood fired pizza oven, giving the club a stronger focus on its catering operations and new club furnishings to update the club in look and feel.

Since my arrival in late November the club has continued to progress itself. A new General Managers office was built giving increased access to both members and staff. The clubs computer server was upgraded, future proofing the club with IT development whilst also adding increased security and communication between senior staff.

The clubs financial systems have had a complete overhaul. Financial results are now produced in a cleaner fashion allowing for true reporting on department success. To Bev and Ernie a large thank you must go out. The transition to updated financial systems was not an easy one and without their support this could not have been achieved.

The financial results achieved last year were positive, especially given the capital outlay mentioned above. The club also has a greater financial understanding across a broader base of staff which will hold the club in a greater position as we move through this uncertain time for the club industry.

As we move forward the goal is now to maintain relevant to our current and future members. This is being tackled on many levels.

From a golf perspective the first week in April is a big week for the club in setting up its future development. The Monday sees Jack Newtown Junior Golf show local school teachers how to teach golf fundamentals to their students. I have strategically worked hard to develop relationships with the local schools to attract juniors to the sport of golf, this is a way of guaranteeing the club in the future.

On the Friday the club hosts its first ever corporate golf day. This day not only thanks the local businesses that currently assist the club but also introduces new businesses and charities to the great facilities we have here at Kiama Golf Club and encourages future partnerships.

Whilst on golf I would like to thank Mark and his team for their efforts throughout the year. It brings me no greater satisfaction as a General Manager then when I have industry experts consistently comment on the fantastic way in which the green staff present the course, whilst doing this under industry average spend. This at the end of the day allows the club to pass on a value for money product to our members and visitors.

As mentioned above the club invested in a wood fired pizza oven. With this the Bistro has now been rebranded Mystics – wood fired cuisine. On my arrival whilst posting a book profit the catering department of the club was recording a considerable loss. This loss could not be sustained and was having no considerable flow on effects to the other areas of the club. It is hoped in the future that Mystics is a brand of its own and not a price driven product as it now stands. In this transition phase I am looking forward to working with our new head chef Nigel who brings with him great success both within the Illawarra and abroad.

Our beverage figures are some of the best in the area and this is something I don't take lightly as it is a major driving factor behind the club. Moving forward we hope to improve the customer service model to allow for efficient, friendly service. As you would all be aware our venue capacity is limited and with this in mind I am currently seeking quotes to add a roof above the balcony area to increase member comfort and capacity.

As we progress through the year we are currently reviewing all our member promotions and opportunities. We are always looking at ways we can offer our membership greater incentives and rewards. Without our loyal membership the club would not prosper and I thank you all for your support during the year.

In closing I would like to thank the staff for their great efforts during the year. Without their effort and commitment the club would not be able to provide the great service that it does. It is not easy when a new General Manager comes in and I thank them all for the support they have offered me. I have no doubt we have the right team here at the club to progress into the future.

Looking forward to seeing you all at the club.

CAPTAINS REPORT

Many challenges have made 2010 a difficult year for golf in Kiama. A new handicap system, course renovations, falling competition fields and external competitive factors are but a few issues we face. Nevertheless, given the exceptionally wet summer/autumn, we still have the most playable golf course in the Illawarra! More than ever members need to get behind the club, support events and take an active role to ensure the viability of golf activities.

A recent article written by Jack Newton in the Australian Golf Digest said "Times change and practises need to be updated because we're not living in the 50's, 60's or 70's. We've got to review some of the long-standing conventions within golf clubs. Some of the beliefs need tweaking to accommodate modern attitudes and lifestyles."

A new energetic club manager and streamlined administration gives us the opportunity to improve promotion of golf and thereby secure our club's future.

Features of golf activity this year include:

Golf Program - competition fields have reduced in all areas and inclement weather over the summer/autumn period has meant a reduced income from golf events. It seems that competitions such as Ambrose, 4BBB etc still attract more players so we are adjusting the program to include more of these type of events. Some traditional club events need reviewing because of the poor visitor response.

Mixed Golf – has enjoyed a very successful year. By expanding mixed events to 2 per month we have increased fields and have more visitors playing. The concept of a golf/dinner package for mixed Sunday golf was difficult to sustain because of the club's promotion of "dinner specials". Similarly the "nine, wine and dine" 9 hole competition was poorly supported.

The Minnamurra Bowl continued its success with over 115 players entered for the 2 day event. This tournament has great potential and we aim to make it the premier mixed event in the Illawarra. Congratulations to the organising committee for their hard work in making this event such a success.

Medley Competitions – in an effort to expand golfing opportunities for women, especially working women, we made Thursday's Pro Competition, some Sunday events and events held on "holidays" Medley events where women and men compete in the same competition but from their respective tees and handicaps. This increases the field size and enables women to compete for better trophies and get some reward for having an excellent round. A mixed response has greeted this initiative with some ladies unhappy with this arrangement but others keen to continue this format. The Match Committee will endeavour to investigate ways in which we can better accommodate small ladies' fields.

Golf Trophies – we are currently investigating the system for issuing trophies at Kiama Golf Club. The current voucher system is very labour intensive and many members are not claiming their trophies. It is anticipated that a new system will be in place mid-year which will better integrate with the club's Point of Sale changes. At the same time there will also be an overhaul of trophy values with the aim of returning more to players.

Golf Membership – golf membership fees were increased this year in line with the CPI. Also there was an increase in the competition fee to reflect the increased costs of maintaining the golf course. With smaller fields on most days there is substantial pressure to keep fees as low as possible yet maintain a high standard course. Golfing membership remains a major issue with numbers of men remaining stable and few new female members. Female juniors in particular need to be secured if ladies golf is to remain strong into the future.

Junior Program – to increase the number of Juniors joining the club we are developing a Junior program to interface with programs already offered through our professional. Greg currently runs a program for over 20 juniors on a Saturday morning. Our Junior program will use resources provided by the Jack Newton Golf Foundation to train up to 30 teachers from local schools to integrate golf instruction into school sport curriculums. We then hope to develop a partnership with Minnamurra Primary School to bring talented students from Years 5 and 6 into structured coaching classes organised by the club. If successful this coaching program will be extended to other local primary schools.

Handicaps and Course Rating – most golfers would be aware of the turmoil surrounding the introduction of the new handicap system. This has forced the realignment of grade/division handicap cut offs for both men and ladies as a direct result of most player handicaps increasing and consequently producing an imbalance in grade/division numbers. Golf Australia is currently reviewing the new handicap process. As part of the proposed new handicap system golf courses have to be rated to compare difficulty. This will occur in May for Kiama. More details will follow but there is no doubt a new scorecard will be required to cater for this initiative.

Pennant Success – Success in Interclub Pennant competition continued in 2010 with the Junior Pennant team and the ladies Silver Pennant team winning. The Juniors went on to play in the State Junior Handicap Matchplay Championship at Newcastle Golf Club, finishing third. The boys were worthy representatives of Kiama Golf Club. Congratulations to all players who participated in these teams. An exceptional effort!!

Future – Challenges facing us in the next 12 months include:

- The new handicap system. This will require rating the course and making changes to signs etc. There will need to be substantial education of members in the operation of the “slope” system. This whole process will take at least 2 years to complete.
- Maintaining playing member numbers.
- Getting club playing members to work cohesively to strengthen our club.
- Course refurbishment and maintenance.
- Keeping the cost of golf at a reasonable level.
- Increasing junior numbers, especially girls and maintaining their interest.

Thank You – During 2010 major contributions to the successful operation of golf at Kiama Golf Club have been made by: Joe Wilson , Frank Turski, the Match Committee, the Ladies Captain Janelle Hoskins and Ladies Committee, Wayne Bennett, Mark Yates and the greens staff, Greg Drummond and his staff, the restaurant staff, the Bar staff and Craig, Kim, Bev and Deb in the office. Special thanks to Paul McTackett the Vice Captain whose assistance over the year has been invaluable. Thank you all for your support and I look forward to another successful golfing year in 2011.

GREENS REPORT

The general condition of some fairways has caused considerable concern to members and green staff alike. Comprehensive testing of soil and water samples has been undertaken. As a result long and short term action plans have been formulated. Discussions with Sydney Water will indicate whether or not a secondary filtration system for treated effluent will be necessary. In the short term bare patches on fairways will be turned over and returfed. The club plans to continue soil and water testing at regular intervals over the next year to monitor the situation.

On the positive side, greens, tees and bunkers are generally in excellent condition and pathways are being renovated according to plan.

To all those members who have given of their time to assist with course maintenance and improvements I offer my sincere thanks. There are far too many to mention here. It is hoped that the Garden party Program will go from strength to strength. Thank you to all concerned.

During the past year the club has purchased two major items of capital equipment, a Kubota tractor and a Greens Mower. There was also upgrade of power to the greenshed.

Expenditure over the next year will concentrate on improving fairway playing surfaces and updating machinery.

Special thanks to Course Superintendent Mark Yates and his staff of David, Keith, Justin, Martin and especially Glen Evans. The club is very fortunate to have such dedicated staff members.

Thanks also to the Greens Committee, Mark Yates, Tug Wilson, Louise Summerhayes, Maureen Wright, Clive Hollands and Russell Worth for their support and valuable input over the past year.
