How To Check If You Have Won A Ball In A KGC Vets Competition

Apart from asking at the pro shop, here is the procedure that you should follow.

Alternative 1.

Log on to the KGC website (kiamagolfclub.com.au) and click on [My Information](#).

Scroll down to [My Results](#) and click on [MORE](#).

Click on [Results](#) for the relevant Vets competition.

Click on [Presentation Prize Report](#). This link is usually at the top of the reports list.

Prize winners for 1st, 2nd & 3rd in each grade will be displayed as well as ball winners (place getters) in the ball competition.

If you want to check on your success in NTP's, go back and click on [Presentation Report - Nearest The Pins](#) and the results will be displayed.

Alternative 2.

Log on to the KGC website, click on [My Information](#) and scroll down to [My Prizes](#).

Click on [MORE](#).

Click on the **Dollars** box and then click on **Other**.

A spreadsheet will open showing vets competition dates and balls won (prize allocation) and if you have collected (redemption) any ball won in vets competitions at KGC

If you click on **Balls** instead of Other (after you have clicked on Dollars) the list that is displayed is a record of balls won in KGC competitions other than vets competitions.

If you are a visitor vet, you will need to check at the pro shop for balls won.

This information will also be displayed on the vets notice board in the downstairs foyer as well as the notice board in the women's room. A flow chart will be available to make it easy to follow.

Note - you have 150 days (5 months) to collect any ball(s) before they are "lost" to consolidated revenue.

Trevor Bell Memorial Shield

Round 3 of this inter club competition was played at The Grange on June 15 and saw Kiama in 2nd place on the leaderboard with Wollongong on top. There was a 13 point difference between the two top teams.

Kiama hosted the 4th round which was played on July 6. Local knowledge came to the fore with Joe Zancolich blitzing the field, scoring 41 stableford points. Garry Barling from the The Links aced the 11th hole and was presented with a dozen balls as well as having his hole in one ball mounted for future admiration.

The leaderboard now shows Kiama on top, 30 points ahead of Wollongong. Both Port Kembla (3rd) and The Links Shell Cove (4th) have a home game to come. An interesting finish is assured. Round 5 is set down for play on August 24 at The Links Shell Cove.
